Reading with Preschooler

The development of full early reading potential for the preschool child is supported through frequent reading experiences with a wide range of quality books. Preschooler early reading develops best when children are matched with books which connect with their life experiences and corresponding age-level. As a developing reader, the preschool child, needs a wide range of reading experiences including reading for entertainment (stories, picture books, chapter books etc.) and reading for information (non-fiction books, catalogues, instruction manuals, recipes etc.)



Choosing books for Preschoolers:

These books are suggestions only and are intended to indicate books which support preschool reading development. The books here are available at most libraries, educational book shops and online. It is not intended that preschoolers read all of the books listed here. Family and teachers are involved in the preschool child's early reading development, reading to and with preschoolers, encouraging preschoolers to read themselves and make their own reading choices and ensuring that books chosen include a variety of information texts and imaginative stories.
